Intercultural Communication Seminar English Literature Department

Course Outline:

Intercultural communication is about communicating with individuals with whom you do not share past experiences. This seminar introduces this concept of intercultural communication, which explores how cultures communicate and interact. It provides an overview of theories of intercultural communication, and examines how culture is evident in languages, behaviors, rituals and worldviews. Specifically, the course investigates the influences on intercultural communication, the development of cultural identities, and issues of inequality so that students can reassess their existing viewpoints and navigate in a global community. In addition, students explore their own communication practices and attitudes through an international writing exchange program with students from the instructor's accredited language school, the Bayon English Academy (BEA), in Siem Reap, Cambodia. Each ICC student is paired with a BEA student, and examines and describes their respective cultural behaviors and heritage through three letters based on an ICC theme.

- **Goals:** 1. to identify, describe and share the beliefs, values and norms of Japanese culture;
 - 2. to recognize differences / similarities between Japanese culture and other cultures;
 - 3. to identify and avoid cultural bias;
 - 4. to view cultural differences objectively and understand that cultural differences are not hierarchal;
 - 5. and to communicate with non-native speakers who have different worldviews, value systems and communicative styles.
